At SMU, a great deal of learning is done online, and most learning materials are provided through the school server, listed below are some useful tips to guide you in getting your laptops configured to smoothly navigate SMU's different websites and portals throughout your university journey!

SCHOOL WIFI CONNECTION

- 1. Look for the network "WLAN_SMU"
- 2. Upon clicking the network, you will be prompted to fill in the following details:
- Username: first part of your school email (e.g. john.doe.2025)
- Password: the password to your school email

SMU PASSWORD MANAGEMENT

You will be required to change your email password every 180 days, otherwise you will be locked out of your account.

*Helpdesk will usually send reminder emails to students, so do keep a lookout for those!

It is important to keep your account active for easy and continual access to school portals and websites.

Upon changing your password, you would need to repeat the steps under "School Wifi Connection" again to gain access to the school wifi.

In the event you get locked out of your school account, there are three ways to unlock you account

- Register for <u>online service</u> (recommended)
- Email in to Helpdesk for assistance helpdesk@smu.edu.sg
- Head down to the IT Help Centre during opening hours

RESPONDUS LOCKDOWN BROWSER ('EXAM')

Here at SMU, some of our tests and examinations are held online, which require the use of Respondus Lockdown. Hence, all students are required to download Respondus Lockdown and click here for a more thorough guide on the installation process.


During the test or examination, you can launch the lockdown browser through "Quizzes" on the respective module page on eLearn. Do remember to bring your laptop charger during the test or examination and keep your laptop charged throughout as you are unable to see your battery status once the browser is launched. Make sure not to accidentally swipe out of the Lockdown Browser, and in the event you do, immediately alert your invigilator.

How to launch or check your Lockdown Browser:

SMU has provided several quizzes with unlimited attempts for you to check and test out your Lockdown Browser. As there may be some system updates over time, it will be good to check before every test or exam.

1. Go onto e-Learn and click on "Student Orientation to e-Learn" (note that module naming may differ)





2. Click on Quizzes and it will lead you to this page. There are different types of quizzes for you to try.



OASIS

*Also known as Online Access to Student Information Systems

OASIS is an online portal that contains a non-exhaustive list of information such as regarding BOSS bidding, curriculum matters, financial assistance schemes, career development and community service matters. It is one of the most widely used platforms for all SMU students as we are able to find most of the information we need on here!

ONTRAC 11

An online platform for students to apply for job/internship positions. It can only be accessed upon completion of the mandatory e-internship online units (refer to Chapter 5 for more details). You can also book appointments with your career coaches (DKHMCC) through this portal.

Every SMU student is assigned to a career coach who will send you an email. You are encouraged to make an appointment with them as they would be able to provide valuable insight as to how you should be mapping out your university journey in the nextfour years in SMU.

FACILITY BOOKING SYSTEM

An online platform, also known as <u>FBS</u>, for students to book facilities such as Group Study Rooms (GSRs), Seminar Rooms (SRs) and Classrooms (CRs) for group study sessions and project discussions. Most of the facilities will require at least 1 co-booker to confirm on the booking! Every student is given 4500 credits per academic year, and will restart at the start of each academic year (AY) (but not to worry, it is rare to use up all your credits).

EXPLORATORY UNITS

In SMU, all undergraduate students are given an option to exclude two course units of passed grades from cGPA computation.

Under the Exploratory Courses Policy, it will only be applicable for modules taken before their final term of coursework (with the exception of compulsory University/Programme Core courses, compulsory Major courses and compulsory Track courses).

In other words, students may declare any two passed non-mandatory or additional courses (i.e. any electives) taken in SMU up to, and including, their penultimate term of coursework as Exploratory Courses.

TEXTBOOKS & RESOURCES

Certain professors recommend students to purchase textbooks for their class.

For single degree students:

Able to declare a maximum of 2 majors (First and Second Majors)

For double degree students:

Primary degree - Able to declare a maximum of 2 majors (First and Second Majors) Secondary degree - Only 1 major (First major)

You will need to declare your second major by the end of your second year in SMU.

Do take note that a <u>penalty of e\$10</u> will be imposed for any drop, amendment or late declaration of Majors.

COMPULSORY ONLINE UNITS

COMMUNITY SERVICE ONLINE UNITS

Before embarking on your community service efforts, you have to complete four mandatory online units: one Reflection Practice Unit (RPU) and three Community Service Units (CSUs) on eLearn.

The RPU will equip you with skills for deeper and more meaningful reflection, while the CSUs will introduce you to guiding principles and tools such as service learning, needs analysis and asset mapping.

It is <u>highly recommended</u> that you complete these units before the semester starts, or minimally before the start of Year 2.



GLOBAL EXPOSURE

At SMU, every student has to fulfil the global exposure requirement before they graduate! Here are some of the programmes students can embark on to clear this requirement. Modules taken overseas will be graded on a Pass/Fail basis and are not counted towards your GPA.

ACCOUNTING / BUSINESS STUDY MISSIONS

Study missions are study programmes that encompass a short overseas study trip. It can usually fulfil the Asia Studies and Global Exposure requirement.

Look out for emails from SoA and LKCSB regarding the study missions. It contains important information that you will need for the application process as well as available financial assistance. Do read up carefully before signing up to ensure the modules you are looking for, can fulfil your degree progress requirement.

Students do not have to bid for ASM/BSM but there is an <u>automatic e\$20</u> deduction upon your acceptance of the offer.

Common destinations for past Accounting or Business Study Missions include South Korea, Hong Kong, Indonesia, Thailand and Taiwan.

SHORT-TERM STUDY PROGRAMME

Look out for emailers from the Centre for Global Education and Opportunities (GEO) on the different short-term study opportunities available during Summer (Term 3A or 3B) and Winter (Modified Term 1).

SSP allows students to clock O.5 to 2 SMU Credit Units (depending on programme).

INTERNATIONAL STUDENT EXCHANGE PROGRAMME

Many SMU students choose to go on exchange for a semester at one of SMU's overseas partner universities during their third or fourth year. However, students are not allowed to go on ISEP if they are in their final semester.

Look out for emailers from the Centre for Global Education and Opportunities (GEO) on the different exchange opportunities available.

Students usually choose to clear the following modules during their exchange:

- Accounting Electives
- Free Electives
- SMU Core Capabilities:
 - Managing (Elective)
 - Modes of Thinking (Elective)
- SMU Core Communities
 - Technology and Society (Elective)
 - Cultures of the Modern World (Elective)

It is important to note that you will only be able to clear up to 2 Accounting Electives during your exchange. Students are not allowed to map any Business or Accounting core modules overseas.

OVERSEAS COMMUNITY SERVICE PROJECT

OCSPs are a great way to help others while clearing the 8O-hour community service requirement! SMU has numerous OCSPs for students to join, make new friends and do good deeds.

Do look out for the recruitment emails sent out by the many OCSPs that will be carried out during the winter and summer holidays. Common destinations are Southeast Asian countries like Thailand, Vietnam and Cambodia.

These trips are usually subsidised (especially if it is your first OCSP) and you can use funds from your PSEA (Post Secondary Education Account) to pay for your OCSP trip as well.

ASOC MENTORING SCHEME

The ASoc Mentoring Scheme (AMS) aims to help incoming freshmen transition into university life by having mentors share their experiences and provide help whenever necessary.

AMS will comprise of two phases this year. Each mentoring group will comprise one mentor and a few freshmen. Freshmen will be assigned to their ASoc Camp facilitators should their facilitators be mentors under this scheme.

For phase 2, each mentor group will be paired with an industry professional so that mentees can gain deeper insight into the different accounting careers.





SOA PEER TUTORING SCHEME

SoA Peer Tutors are students who are academically stronger and handpicked to assist other students academically, under the guidance of the Dean and other professors. They conduct revision workshops for key Accounting modules before the Final examinations.

<u>Financial Accounting Bootcamp</u>

It is usually held a week before the new term starts. The session is optional, but all freshmen are welcome and encouraged to join!

<u>Peer Tutors Finals Revision Workshops</u>

At the end of the semester, the Peer Tutors will hold finals revision workshops for some of the core Accounting modules where they will go through sample papers and the answers. Do keep a lookout for their emails and sign up for the workshops!

PROJECT MOOLAH

ASoc's very own local Community Service Project (CSP) that <u>promotes financial literacy</u> to local secondary students. Get a chance to meet friends from other faculties as it is open to all SMU students. All SMU students can participate as an organising committee member or facilitator.

Participating in this project will contribute towards fulfilling the Community Service Requirements.

SMU FACILITIES

Unsure of what benefits you have as an SMU student? Don't worry!

Listed below are some of the commonly used facilities used or visited by most students over the past few years.

SMU CONNEXION

A popular study space and an ideal location for project meetings, located between the School of Accountancy (SoA) and the School of Law (YPHSL).

SMU Connexion includes facilities like active learning classrooms, brainstorming hubs, collaborative zones, integrated learning studios, makerspace and student lounges. These facilities may be booked on the Facility Booking System but not to worry, there are plenty of study spaces within Connexion that are free for all!

Dining options are also available on Level 1 (Refer to Chapter 8).

SMU GYM & FITNESS CENTRE

Located along the concourse under the School of Computing and Information Systems (SCIS), the three-story Gymnasium and Fitness Centre is open exclusively to SMU students (and it is free of charge of course!).

The facility, comprising two fitness studios and one gymnasium, spans 3 levels and is wheelchair friendly.

SMU SWIMMING POOL

SMU CLINIC

Feeling under the weather? Just head over to TheClinicCampus, located at Li Ka Shing Library, Basement I. The clinic is conveniently located on campus, where SMU students are entitled to free consultations and standard medication.

Clinic Opening Hours:

Monday to Friday: 8.3Oam to 5.3Opm

Saturday: 8.3Oam to 12.3Opm

Closed on Sundays and Public Holidays

There are also free consultations at clinics all over Singapore. To view the list of clinics that you can visit, visit <u>here</u>.

You can also attend online consultations via the app as well as have medicine and a medical certificate delivered to you, free of charge. Do remember to show your matriculation card upon registration. You can also claim for consultation, standard medication, and simple lab tests at a number of GP panel clinics as well as government polyclinics.

THE COZY HAVEN

The Cosy Haven is only open during weeks 3 to 7, and 9 to 13 during the school semester and is managed by the SMU Peer Helpers.
